Approval of Minutes

Report of the Student Advisory Committee

Mr. Monroe spoke of athletics, honor society, and other happenings at FHS. Ms. DaCunha also commented on Athletics, clubs, field trips, and the music festival.

Receive presentation from FHS Unified Program

Mr. Kulak presented. He stated that Fairhaven High School was recently recognized as a National Banner School, by the Special Olympics, one of 12 in Massachusetts, and one of 166 in the country. Mrs. Allaire presented a history of the Unified program at Fairhaven High School and how far it has come. The Committee commented on the growth of the program and how they hope to help it continue.

Receive presentation from FHS student Nathan Deslauriers on his Eagle Scout Project for FHS

Mr. Kulak introduced Nathan Deslauriers, a junior at Fairhaven High School. He stated that Mr. Deslauriers had approached the administrative team at the end of last year. Mr. Deslauriers presented his Eagle Scout project. It is an Emergency Lockdown Bucket. Among many item, each bucket contains items such as tape, toilet paper, door stops, and gloves.

Receive update on concerns regarding Vaping/Smoking Concerns

Mrs. Kohler presented. She stated this is an ongoing in issue, not only in Fairhaven, but nationwide. She stated a PSA will be going out for families to bring it to their attention. She spoke of a lawsuit against the vaping companies. She would like to join the lawsuit. She hopes that it may be able to help pay us back for some of the monitors and other things we have purchased preventatively. Motion to join the lawsuit against the vaping companies made by Mr. Monroe, seconded by Mr. Andersen, 5-0, unanimously.

Receive update regarding FY24 Budget Process

Mrs. Kohler presented. She indicated a desire to stay transparent with the Committee and the community. The Committee was presented with schedules. The schedules and timelines were reviewed. Mrs. Kuechler and Mr. Bueno discussed the possibility of inviting the Finance Committee to the School Committee meetings to help remain transparent and clarify any questions.

Receive update on Capital Improvement Projects

Mrs. Kohler presented. The first update is that New Bedford Voc should be working with us on by January to give us the plans for the High School project. The other update is that we should be receiving bid documents in early February for the preservation project at the High School. The CPC Committee has been ongoing. Spencer Preservation and Mrs. Potter have discussed whether or not it will broaden or offset. We hope that we can broaden the project, possibly extending to the slate roof.
